

hank you for taking the time to read this report. As we reflect back on 2019, our 11th year as an organization, we see a year of continuing consolidation, maturity and growth. It's been a real privilege working with partners serious about solving real issues and making their efforts count, as well as generous donors from all over the globe wanting their hardearned money to change the world. We are so glad to be fighting for a better future with you all.

2019 was a year that saw us expand our footprint of impact by 10% (both financially and at project levels). Our best estimate is that we significantly impacted the lives of over 16,000 women and children. "Significantly impacted" is an important statement for us as we, like our partners and donors, want our time here on earth to count. Captivating is about sustainable solutions and life-altering intervention. For example, 2019 saw:

- The "interception" of 7,574 girls at Captivating funded monitoring stations in Nepal. This simple act may well have saved these girls from becoming the next trafficking victims;
- 3,092 women start or continue to progress their family businesses thanks to Captivating funded programs in Nepal, the Philippines and China. This directly impacted over 9,000 lives when you include their children;
- 457 girls considered under-educated and at-risk of a lifetime of abuse started or continued to progress 3 year vocational school degrees, or 6 month intensive skills based learning aimed at getting them into their first secure job - an act that increases significantly their independence and choices.

Additionally, but not included in our 16,000 "significantly impacted" number above were over 3,000 women educated on important family health matters in China; over 20 million having access to Nepal wide anti-Human Trafficking messages via radio; 11,000 children taught about the dangers of cyber-sex and human trafficking in the Philippines and Nepal; 1,615 women receiving assistance with domestic violence and legal issues. It's been a GREAT year of impact, and we are proud of our partners.

But, for all of our satisfaction and gratitude with what 2019 has been, it is with sadness that we have a world now focused on fighting a new invisible enemy - the COVID-19 global pandemic. Like all charities, we are bracing for a challenging 2020 as we struggle to continue to meet the escalating needs of the poor needs that are now getting significantly worse for many as the meager incomes they were previously earning dry up completely. We brace for what will be spikes in the incidence of human trafficking as levels of desperation increase. Significant increases in already high levels of domestic violence; and the challenges for our women in our microfinance programs as they wait through current lockdowns in the Philippines and the Nepal. More than ever, we are thankful for our trustworthy and diligent partners, as well as our loyal support base.

Quite fittingly, our 2020 theme is "RISE UP - Move Mountains". This is the attitude that is required for all of us to survive this current crisis. As an organization, we live with great hope and courage. There is too much at stake. Working together, we will survive what will likely be our toughest year to-date, and we will live to fight another day. For such a time as this.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Rise up

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As Chairman of Captivating International Foundation Limited (CIF) it is my pleasure to write this reflection and to acknowledge the amazing work and impact of the Captivating family. The theme of this year is Rise Up which is fitting given the once in a lifetime event that we are all living through.

It was early March and I had just locked in the final details of a supporter tour to see Captivating programs in Nepal. There was a sense of excitement that we were going to visit this amazing country with donors who had given so much to support our anti human trafficking work. Sitting at my desk an email flashed onto my screen 'Nepal's borders are closed'. The world was shrinking and becoming very small before my eyes. With disappointment I contacted each participant and cancelled the trip. We then started to turn our minds to the impact Covid-19 was having on the Captivating world and more importantly the poor.

The people who suffer the most in global calamities are the poor. While Western governments were announcing multi-billion-dollar relief packages, poor countries bunkered down with little to

no ability to support their populations. The poor countries have medical systems incapable of responding to a pandemic of this nature. Further, communities rapidly fall into starvation and their desperate poverty makes them even more susceptible to human trafficking.

As Chairman I have been so heartened by the response each of our partners has implemented to tackle this challenge. In our fundraising and implementation offices, staff have voluntarily taken a 20-30% pay cut. All non-essential costs have been frozen. I have been amazed by the sacrifices beyond this. In Nepal our radio station has been working at full capacity communicating pandemic messages. Through this initiative our help desks have been inundated by cries for help. With people starving our Nepal staff voluntarily decided to forgo one meal a day using the funds saved to feed their starving community. In the Philippines all microfinance loan repayments have been frozen giving families breathing space to survive. For many years we have linked a saving plan to the microfinance loans and this has been a life saver to many families who now can access emergency funds to survive. What a lesson in the value of saving for a rainy day.

This is up once again due to the continued high levels of impact in the numbers of women and children being


supported in Nepal, Philippines and China.

OUR CHARITY PROJECT PARTNERS









etween January and December 2019, 7,574 women and girls were stopped at 11 Captivating funded monitoring stations in Nepal. We believe this simple act may have prevented many of them from a life of torture, abuse and slavery. 554 girls were referred to the police because substantial, hard evidence was found to confirm that trafficking was involved.

In cooperation with our Nepal-based partners, 3 Angels Nepal and Tiny Hands International,

small but effective police-approved checkpoints have been set up near important border crossing or transit hub locations.

Trained staff with government approval stop any suspicious looking cases, interview girls and their escorts to clarify their travel plans' legitimacy. Following risk-based questionnaires, suspicious cases will be investigated further, which may or may not lead to approval to proceed across the border.

RESCUES AND RAIDS

uring 2019, 43 girls and women were rescued from brothels and pimps in Nepal and India. Carefully planned close coordination with local police and government officials, these dangerous rescues and raids are returning girls to safety and freedom.

Medical help, counselling and legal help is provided for these girls and women. Usually a court case is filed against the perpetrator and more often than not, results in traffickers being sentenced to prison.

MY BUSINESS - MY FREEDOM MICROFINANCE PROGRAM

432 women, an increase of 55% from 2018, are now part of the My Business-My Freedom microfinance program, helping vulnerable women to address their poverty. This program changes their lives. And, it's all controlled by them. Each woman is helped to establish HER own business, focused on ensuring HER continued freedom, and the freedom of her children. She received training on how to run her business, how to manage her money and save, and receive a loan which she pays back with interest.

Until a vulnerable woman is helped to address her poverty, she will still be attracted to the prospect of migration out of her home village. This leaves her vulnerable with a high risk of human trafficking. Many older women also join this program as their success increases the family income and ensures greater levels of safety for her children and education.

COMMUNITY RADIO BROADCASTING

The 3 Angels Community Radio Program (3ACR) has been broadcasting for 7 years and grown to a point where it reaches an estimated 21,000,000 Nepali people which is about 96% of Nepal. Broadcasting for 17 hours a day and linked with 42 relay stations, 3ACR's programs are reaching people in remote locations, bringing awareness about human trafficking as well as other important issues such as legal aid, children's programs, agricultural help, and health and hygiene programs.





Additionally, since COVID-19 issues have impacted Nepal early in 2020, this radio station has been used by the government to promote health and risk management issues to control the spreading of the virus.

HUSKY ENERGY TAILORING SKILLS PROGRAM FOR WOMEN

he 2019 Husky Energy Tailoring Skills for Women Program started in July 2019 and ended in November 2019. 30 women, aged between 19 to 37 years, came from various villages in remote Qinghai. Some of them have only studied until primary level, while the majority haven't been to school at all. This has made it difficult for them to find a decent and stable job (leaving many of them at risk of exploitation).

During the four-month training, the women learned about the theory of tailoring, how to measure and cut out fabric, and how to operate a sewing machine. They learned how to make traditional Tibetan and Mongolian clothes as well as quality Chinese clothing. In November 2019, 24 women successfully graduated from the program.

Through this program, 24 women acquired not only employable skills but also the confidence in themselves to help support and provide a better future for their families and children.

Thank you to Husky Energy for believing in these women and giving them the chance to develop skills so they can earn a stable income. Our next Husky program is scheduled to commence in June 2020.





VOCATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

he first cohort of the three-year Vocational School Scholarship program graduated from their course in July 2019. 46 graduates in total from the 60 students who started in 2016. 27 of these girls have secured employment while a further 17 were able to secure sponsorship to continue into advanced education.

We are very proud of each of the 261 girls still currently in the program, and the positive steps they are taking for their future.

- 63 girls will graduate this June (2020),
- 96 girls are half way through their 2nd year of studies.
- 102 girls started their studies in September 2019.

The girls travel from different places throughout Qinghai Province and are attending wonderful schools where they are studying:

- Nursing
- Tibetan Medicine
- Accounting
- Business Management
- Preschool Education
- Computer and Architecture
- Applied Chemical Engineering (specialized design and construction of production plants for innovative chemical processes)

The Vocational School Scholarship Program is continuing to reach the needs of disadvantaged girls who have had to drop school because of financial difficulty or prejudice. Seeing the reaction of a girl being told she can complete vocational high school is priceless. During the 3-year program, each girl works hard to learn as much as they can. They are grateful for the opportunity and make the most of every day.

MY HEALTH, MY FAMILY, OUR SAFETY PROGRAM

The My Health, My Family, Our Safety Awareness Program traveled through Western China during 2019 with the team of nurses and a doctor. There were 11 village stops that catered to the health needs of over 3,000 men and women. Medical checks, medicines and hygiene products were given to the participants along with important information about how to stay healthy and remain safe from STDs, TB and other easily transmitted diseases.

The attending doctor confirmed that 95% of the 1,929 women who received medical examinations, suffered from gynecological health issues. The doctor believed that much of this could be prevented with knowledge of good hygiene practices and making the health of women in their communities a higher priority.

200 families received 2 pigs each during 2019. Each family (mostly single mom households) received training from professionals on pig breeding as well as vaccination schedules, providing quality feed and understanding the importance that healthy pigs means more piglets. Each family was very excited to receive their pigs and are confident that they will achieve self-sustainability.

Pig breeding can increase family income as well as allowing moms to stay home and run their small businesses rather than leaving the children at home on their own to go to the city to work.

Our thanks to GPA Global for underwriting our 2019 and upcoming 2020 project, and to the 11th Annual Charity Auction attendees. Together, we will help bring financial independence to those who need help.

We estimate that the lives of 600 women and children have been improved through this program this past year.





HOUSE OF LOVE

House of Love provides care, ability training, and psychological counseling for orphans and persons with special needs. It also provides services for children with different degrees of mental and physical learning conditions such as painting, reading, writing, jigsaw puzzle, etc., as well as hand-knitting, one-to-one psychological counseling, and healthy habit training. These services aim to stimulate the children's internal potential, enhance their confidence, equip them to help others with disabilities, and help them find value and significance in life while having fun.

Between January and December 2019, we have underwritten the work of HOL supporting a total of 206 orphans and persons with special needs.

STOP CYBERSEX CRIME

adly, the Philippines is the number 1 country in the world for child online sexual abuse, with over 20,000 child pornographic images uploaded each week. We strongly believe that education is the key to systemic and sustainable change. The school based Cyber Safety program reached 3,079 school students during 2019. The aim of this program is to reduce the future incidence of trafficking and cybersex crime through the implementation of targeted advocacy and community/school education strategies to "high-risk" locations.

Our partner, the Honor 1000 Movement, is seeing greater government support with the Philippine National Police, Department of Social Welfare and Development and Department of Labor and Employment partnering together to protect children. This partnership intensifies efforts and increases the credibility of the program.





HONOR 1000 MICROFINANCE

Ithough the Philippine government is increasing its efforts to combat the atrocity of sexually exploitation of children online, the poverty of so many families will continue to be the driving factor behind their desperation to make money.





he Honor 1000 Microfinance program continues to make a real impact on the lives of women trapped in poverty with little to no opportunities to change their situation. 2,460 women and their families are currently part of this program. This is positively impacting an estimated 10,000 lives.

Each of the 2,460 women receive training on how to run her business, how to manage her money and save, and a loan which she pays back with interest. Some of the small businesses established include, hog raising, poultry raising, snack bars, mini convenience stores and food canteens.

MARATHON IN A MONTH GLOBAL

Our very first Marathon in a Month global run raised US\$9,000 in October 2019. 36 runners signed up to run a marathon (42kms). We were thrilled with how our pilot event rolled out.
